WORLD'S HIGHEST ROAD TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS IN INDIA: WHO

Road traffic accidents, according to the World Health Organisation (WHO), are the second major cause of death in the world while India holds the dubious distinction of registering the highest number of road traffic accidents globally.

In 2012, India, with 30 crore vehicles, accounted for 1,30,000 road accidents, according to Dr Pradipta Tripathy, Professor in the Department of Neurosurgery at the IMS and Sum Hospital here.

The four major factors of road accidents were bad road conditions, speeding by drivers, drunk driving and refusal to use safety measures like helmets and seatbelts and inefficient law enforcement, Dr Tripathy said at a two-day National Seminar on Road Traffic Accidents that began at the IMS and Sum Hospital on Saturday.

Quoting official records, Dr Tripathy said the number of road mishaps in India increased from 54,100 in 1990 to 1,30,000 in 2012.

“As far as management of road accidents is concerned, this grave problem is receiving much less attention than it deserves,” Dr. Sanjay Kulshrestha, consultant paediatric surgeon at the Sarkar Hospital for Women and Children,

Agra, said. Reduction in fatalities can be achieved by preventing accidents and through better post-accident management of victims, he said.

Dr Kulshrestha said that of the total number accident victims, 24 per cent can be saved through simple trauma care, 46 per cent through advanced trauma care and the rest 30 per cent cannot be saved through any intervention including the best medical care facility in the world.

It is because the impact of accident in such cases is so severe that it causes death instantaneously or within a few minutes before medical help could arrive. Prevention, he said, remains the only answer to such tragedies.

This would be made possible by eliminating the causes of road accidents as 80 per cent to 90 per cent of the mishaps are the result of human error. "Mistakes by drivers or other commuters on the roads are directly or indirectly responsible for road accidents while speeding and overtaking remain the two major causes of fatal accidents," he said.

Baby, there's trouble in the air

GRAVE RISK Women living close to busy roads are more likely to have babies with congenital defects

VARANASI: Increasing vehicular pollution poses a grave risk to unborn babies.

Studies have revealed that pregnant women living close to busy roads or on highways are likely to either have premature deliveries or else babies plagued by congenital deformities (birth defects) because of vehicular pollution. This was stated by Dr Sanjay Kulshrestha, consultant paediatric surgeon from New Delhi, here.

Dr Kulshrestha has authored the book 'Tsunami on Road

Wake Up India!' The book vividly deals with road accidents and vehicular air pollution in the country.

Dr Kulshrestha, who was recently in Varanasi to deliver a lecture on the subject during IMS-BHU golden jubilee celebrations, spoke to HT.

He said a study on pregnant women in US had shown that air pollution (mainly caused by vehicles) could increase chances of birth defects, foetal growth and retardation, besides premature delivery. The risk was more in cases where pregnant women reside close to busy roads/highways, or when exposure to pollution occurred dur-

ing the first or the last three months of pregnancy.

According to a WHO report in 2007, air pollution (72 per cent of which is caused by vehicular pollution and 20 per cent by industrial pollution) in India causes over 5.22 lakh premature deaths annually.

This comes to around one-fourth of the total two million deaths occurring worldwide due to air pollution.

The WHO study further put 4-8 per cent of all deaths due to air pollution, 72 per cent of which caused by vehicular air pollution. Pregnant women, the elderly and young children are more susceptible to pollution.

REPORT ON GOLDEN JUBILEE WORKSHOP ON ROLE OF TECHNICAL EDUCATION IN INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT IN INDIA HELD ON OCTOBER 22, 2011, ROORKEE

On the occasion of Grand Finale of GOLDEN JUBILEE Function, Roorkee Local Centre of The Institution of Engineers (India) organized a workshop on the theme of ROLE OF TECHNICAL EDUCATION IN INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT IN INDIA. The

workshop was attended by about 200 persons consisting of students, engineers, architects, town planners, professionals and print/electronic media persons. The Chairman of the centre Prof. Satya Prakash elaborated on the activities of the centre and apprised about various workshops and seminars held during Golden Jubilee year. He also talked about the contribution of various office bearers in last 50 years. Besides the academic activities, the centre is also running a library which consists of important books and documents for the use of students at large. The convener and the coordinator of the workshop Prof. Rajesh Chandra gave a detailed view of the workshop and emphasised on the use of energy, transport sector, water and sanitation problem in various human settlements. The first speaker, Prof. H.C. Handa, Director General Quantum, delivered his talk on Infrastructure and technical education in India. He insisted on quality technical education saying that lacs of technical graduates passing out every year should be trained to do quality work. Er. B.M. Kohli, Director General (Pers), Military Engineering Services, New Delhi talked about high rise buildings, planning, construction and management. He said that high rise trend is emerging mainly due to liberalisation and globalisation of economy, and also touched upon points like foundations, facades, utilities, maintenance, administration, energy and environmental issues related to high rise. He inferred that all the structures should have seismic, wind loads and sustainable considerations. Brigadier Suresh Sharma, Commandant BEG & Centre, Roorkee spoke on military infrastructure. He explained major categories of the military infrastructure, namely, Combat Zone, MES, BRO, and also the major tasks taken by the BRO are border roads, bridges, airfields etc in border areas and relief works undertaken during natural disasters. **Dr. Sanjay Kulshrestha, Consultant Paediatric Surgeon, along with Dr. Meeta, talked about road traffic hazards and occurrences and consequences of road accidents, problems such as traffic congestion, jams and pollution.** Prof. R.D.Singh, Director National Institute of Hydrology, Roorkee gave a detailed overview of water resources and emphasised that Infrastructure should be developed to meet present and future needs. He further stressed on conservation of water and increasing the ground water table by ground water recharge. Padamashri Prof. A.S. Arya, Former National Seismic Adviser and an eminent academician, talked about national policy on natural disaster management. He stated that the central government has taken all the measures to derive a National Policy on Natural Disaster Management covering all the issues and problems related to construction in disaster prone areas. He also insisted that practical education and school education are the major sources to engrave social awareness and consciousness regarding disaster management to produce better results for the society. The chief guest of the function, Prof. S.K. Bhattacharyya, Director, CSIR-CBRI Roorkee, addressed the gathering on green structures and structural health monitoring. He emphasised on Green structures which are environmentally responsible, sustainable and resource efficient. He gave a detailed overview on LEED and GRIHA rating systems and sustainable concrete technology.



6. Representative of Institute of Road Traffic Education presented their views before the Committee on the qualifications of Members and Chairperson of the Board, absence of systemized traffic enforcement in the country, lack of scientific investigation into road accidents and setting up of boards at state level.

7. Representatives of Automotive Research Association of India while welcoming the establishment of national safety board emphasized the need for coordinating various research institutes in road sector under the Board. They also expressed their apprehensions over the structure of the board and its members.

8. Dr. Sanjay Kulshreshtha presented his views on the reduction of deaths on roads and also on the alarming rise in number of vehicles in the country. He informed the Committee about the necessity for introduction of traffic safety subject at school level and redesigning of roads and vehicles for reduction of road fatalities.

9. A verbatim record of proceedings of the meeting was kept.

10. The Committee adjourned at 1.05 P.M.

Need to check road accident deaths: Transport minister

SAFETY CHECK Agra ranks 6th in country in number of deaths per road accident

AGRA: Highlighting the fact that Agra ranked sixth in the country in cases of road severity (average number of deaths in an accident), minister for state transport Swatantra Dev Singh on Saturday stressed on the need to bring down the death rate and check accidents.

Singh was addressing a seminar organised by Voice of School Association (UP) at Sur Sadan hall. While he was the chief guest on the occasion, editor-in-chief of Hindi daily Hindustan, Shashi Shekhar, presided the seminar.

Singh informed the audience that severity of road accidents, measured by average deaths caused in accidents, was higher in Uttar Pradesh as compared to south India.

"In 2015, there were approximately 17,000 deaths due to road accidents in the state which was 9.3 % higher than 2014. In 2016, there were 9,300 deaths. When compared to states like Kerala, the average accidental deaths are higher in UP. In south, drivers are more particular about safety norms leading to lesser accidents," stated the minister.

"Our government is serious about this issue and would hold a meeting of state council on road safety to lower the death rate in

accidents. Training sessions were held in Kanpur and Bareilly for drivers of our state buses. We have declared an award of Rs 1,000 for those who send a photograph of the driver using head-phones while driving," Singh added.

"During my month-long stay in Kutch area in Gujarat during the poll campaign recently, I heard about only two major accidents. Noticed that there are no cases of road rage and Gujaratis easily give way to other vehicles to pass. Adequate care was taken of the drivers' food and rest," he said. Citing the example of Prime

Minister Narendra Modi and former president late Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam he said the duo always followed traffic rules and students should learn from them. Editor-in-chief of Hindustan, Shashi Shekhar, asked the students to focus on four principles—hard work, discipline, strong determination and far-sightedness.

"These four principles were written on the walls during the emergency and used to inspire me a lot," he said adding that students should not hesitate to help those injured in road accidents.

"There is a lot of development

along the expressway, but at the same time we need to be careful about speed and traffic norms while driving on these stretches," highlighted Shekhar.

He also stressed on finer traffic aspects including the necessity to be in control of the vehicle while driving, prompt use of brakes and the ability to gauge other drivers on the road.

Dr. Sanjay Kulkarni, noted expert on road traffic hazards, gave a detailed account of tragedies caused due to road accidents. State president of Voice of School Association (UP) Rahul Raj welcomed the guests.
